Students in Choral Ensemble are expected to participate in performances throughout the school year. Open to 7th and 8th grade students. Choral Ensemble rehearses Tuesday mornings before school, with some after school and weekend rehearsal throughout the season. Students must audition to be in Choral Ensemble. Auditions are in September at the beginning of the school year.

Science Olympiad	Science Olympiad is a nationally recognized program that provides students the opportunity to investigate various fields of science, math, and technology. Students in Science Olympiad become experts in their events and then compete against other middle schools in the area at invitationals, a regional competition, and potentially a state and national tournament. Practices are held twice a week in season and roughly 20-30 students are selected for the program. The events themselves consist of subject specific events (i.e. rocks and minerals, disease detective, A&P, heredity, etc.), lab-based events (i.e. crime busters, density lab, circuit lab, potions and poisons, etc.) and technology based events (mousetrap vehicle, elastic launch glider, bottle rocket, hovercraft, etc.). Funding for the program comes from Warwick Education Foundations sponsorship.
Sewing Lab	Sew Lab is a club open to any 7th or 8th grader who is interested in learning how to sew on a sewing machine. Meetings will take place after school, once a month. Over the course of the year, each club member will learn the parts of a sewing machine, practice stitching different seams, and make a drawstring bag!
