1. 2017-2018 Budget Dr. Melanie Calender Dr. Ryan Axe Mr. Fred Griffiths Mr. Nathan Wertsch

Dr. Calender and Dr. Axe shared anticipated elementary and secondary staffing needs for the 2017-2018 school year. Mr. Griffiths presented a plan for a 21<sup>st</sup> century learning initiative focusing on the "Four C's" (communication, collaboration, critical thinking and creativity). Mr. Wertsch shared the 2017-2018 proposed final budget. He provided information addressing general fund tracking as related to revenue and expenses to date, and the impacting factors. Key metrics considered in the budget development, state budget developments, bond refinancing, healthcare expenses, special education placement expenses, and tax revenue implications were also discussed. Expenses were presented with an emphasis on the continued search for ways to save money. The budget presentation is available on the Warwick website and a timeline for the budget process is included.

- 2. Student Representative Report Connor Wentworth
  - See attached report
- 3. K-12 Counseling Career Plan Counseling Team
  - Looking for recommendation to bring the Chapter 339 K-12 Counseling Plan to the Board for approval
  - District demographics were shared. Career and Technology Center data was provided. Currently, 111 students attend. There is a 32% increase in students that have applied for next year from the 15/16 school year.
  - Strategies were shared about how the District will increase communication and awareness about the CTC opportunities that are available to the students.
  - Career goals were shared for the elementary, middle and high school levels.
  - The Education Committee recommends the Board approve the Chapter 339 K-12 Counseling Plan
- 4. Student Services Data Melanie Calender
  - Dr. Calender provided the 2017 Special Education & Risk Assessment Data Summary
  - 499 students (11%) currently receive special education services
  - Chapter 15 (504 Accommodation Plans) 174 Students (4%)
  - Chapter 16 Gifted Services 233 students (6%)
  - Historical overview provided from June 2010 to May 2017 for all categories
  - Total Students identified with Special Needs 24%
  - Risk Assessments 140 risk assessments completed since Feb. 2017 to date
- 5. Multi-disabilities Support Program (MDS) Juliet Ashton
  - This will serve as a K-6 program.
  - Currently 6 elementary students are in outside placement.
  - This will provide students the opportunity receive their education in their home district.
- 6. Other Items:
  - Dual Enrollment Courses Dr. Ron Hallett
    - $\circ$  Currently does not apply towards GPA or class rank
    - Did not want to hold a student back to taking a college course for fear of it not counting towards their GPA or class rank
    - $\circ$  The recommendation is to change it to offer dual enrollment courses as a weighted 1.2 class
    - Concern was raised about the college course being comparable in difficulty to an AP course to receive 1.2 weight
    - Dr. Hallett will take this back to the guidance department with the committee's concerns.

- 2017-18 Food Service Budget Mrs. Karen Miller shared the proposed 2017-2018 Food Service budget. She reviewed the lunch pricing equity before reviewing possible lunch prices for the coming school year. She then tied the possible prices for lunch for the 17/18 school year to the project budget outlooks. Mrs. Miller then reviewed the 16/17 original budget, the 16/17 anticipated expenses, and the 17/18 anticipated budget.

**Recommendation** – It is recommended that the Board approve option #1 for the 2017-2018 Food Service Budget. This would hold the current prices for the 2017-2018 school year.

3. 2017-18 General Fund Proposed Final Budget – Mr. Wertsch shared the proposed General Fund Final Budget for the 2017-18 school year that includes a 3% tax increase. Specifics were shared from the revenue side and the expense side. He then shared key metrics to consider when creating a budget, as well as information related to property tax reform, basic education funding, special education funding, and transportation funding. A review of healthcare and special education expenses, with history, was reviewed. Tax revenue implications in 2017-18 were shared for the current budget year, and the coming budget year. Expense budget cause of change was reviewed, with salaries and benefits accounting for the majority of funds. In addition, Mr. Wertsch shared a look ahead for the anticipated 2018-19 expense increases related to salaries, PSERS, healthcare, and debt service. A current fund balance analysis was also shared. Finally, the 2017-18 General Fund Proposed Final Budget timeline was shared.

**Recommendation** – It is recommended that the Board approve the current 2017-18 General Fund Proposed Final Budget.
