The WSD is pleased with the overall performance of our students in regards to meeting the AYP targets in the areas of attendance, graduation rates, academic performance, and test participation. During the 2009-2010 school year Warwick High School was able to meet AYP targets in all schools and across all grade spans. In 2010, the IEP subgroup in grade span 9-12, reached the AYP target utilizing the Safe Harbor model. This subgroup had not made AYP in the year 2009 and was targeted for additional intervention in order to make AYP. This effort was successful. Preliminary data for the 2011 school year show the possibility that the subgroup will make AYP.

Each year the Warwick School District Act 48 committee meets to discuss the district sponsored professional education options. The representative committee consists of elected members of faculty and administration. The committee considers the professional learning needs of the staff through the analysis of the following sources of data:

Each year the Warwick School District Act 48 committee meets to discuss the district sponsored professional education options. The product of this discussion is a catalogue of district sponsored inservice activities which is then distributed to all professional employees

An inservice education program is developed for members of the professional staff for the improvement of staff competency, the improvement of educational program or for other purposes considered appropriate by members of the faculty, the administrative and the supervisory staff.

Inservice education is a joint responsibility of teachers, principals and supervisors and is conducted, when appropriate, following approval of specific activities by the Superintendent of Schools. The implementation of the inservice programs follow the district inservice plan approved by the Board.

Teachers may fulfill their inservice contractual requirements with the approval of their immediate supervisor and principal in the following ways:

- 1. District sponsored inservice days
- 2. Intermediate Unit sponsored courses
- 3. Departmental or building activities developed by supervisors or principals
- 4. Approved evening or weekend educational conferences
- 5. School District sponsored evening workshops
- 6. Individual designed.

Non-Instructional employees of the school district may attend inservice programs planned and developed by groups or associations, which are conducted during the school day, only with prior approval of the Superintendent. Such programs should be directly related to the work responsibilities of the employee.
